WILSON DID NOT TAKE STAND ON ALLIED DEBT

ST. AUGUSTINE, Fla., Feb. 15.—(U. P.)—President Wilson made no commitment, either direct or indirect, regarding the cancellation of the allied debts at the Paris peace conference, Thomas W. La Mont, who acted as financial adviser there, today told President-elect Harding. Harding, he said, "is free as the air" in the matter of settling the allied debts. La Mont, a member of the firm of J. P. Morgan & Company, came here at the request of Harding, who wanted to gather first hand information regarding the transactions at Paris. It is said that Harding showed a keen interest in the financial situation involved in the war settlement.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 15.—(U. P.)—An amendment providing for calling a disarmament conference of representatives of the United States, Great Britain and Japan was offered to the naval appropriation bill by Senator Borah.
