GREAT NOVEL BY CHURCHILL SCREENED

Every reader of current literature will recall the sensation caused by the publication several years ago of Winston Churchill's powerful novel "The Inside of the Cup." The story attacked the alleged hypocrisy of certain clergymen and men of wealth identified with churches as vestrymen. The philosophy of the book was criticized by churchmen in this country and in England as an unwarranted attack upon religion and the cloth.

The picture rights having been obtained by Cosmopolitan at great expense, the story was pictured by Albert Capellan, a famous director and the film version will be shown at the Arcade Theater today. The essential features of the story which is one of great dramatic force, have been retained while the antihypocrisy philosophy of the author necessarily has been subordinated to the general theme.

The story deals with the Rector of a fashionable church who turns upon his wealthy parishioners when he discovers them parading under a mask of hypocrisy and invites the common people to attack his church. Eldon Parr, a vestryman, unscrupulous and tyrannical, alienates his son and daughter and is finally killed by a man whom he has ruined. There is a pretty love romance between the Rector and Parr's daughter which ends happily. The leading roles are played by William P. Carleton and Edith Hallor.

NEW CLAYTON PICTURE AT THE ALTA TODAY

"The Price of Possession" Film Vehicle for Star

For the first time since 1917, Ethel Clayton produced a picture in New York, her latest vehicle being an adaptation of the novel, "The Price of Possession," by the English author, Winkford Boggs. The picture, which will be shown at the Alta Theater today, is the first Miss Clayton has done since her return from Europe.

The continuity was written by Eve Unsell who picked up "The Price of Possession" in England. The scenes are laid in Australia and the London suburbs. The story, replete with dramatic situations, revolves around two nephews, one of whom steals a birthright and flees to Australia. The other nephew follows and kills him. His wife accepts the birthright, but, after intense inward struggles and numerous dramatic incidents she gives it up.

Miss Clayton's leading man is Rockcliffe Fellows well known on the stage and screen. Others in the cast include Reginald Denny, who has just completed an important role in the George Fitzmaurice production, "Money Mad," Maude Turner Gordon and Fuller Melish.

AVERAGE ARMY WILL HAVE 156,666 MEN

WASHINGTON, Mar. 3.—(U. P.)—Twenty-two hours before the present congress expires, all the regular appropriation bills, except the two naval and sundry civil measures, have been passed, and sent to the president. The senate, and house sent the army bill to the president after agreeing on the average size army to be \$5,646 exclusive of the Philippine scouts and flying cadets.

DAMAGE SUIT IS FILED BY THE NEW YORK CALL

WASHINGTON, March 3.—(U. P.)—A suit for five hundred thousand has been filed by the New York Call against Postmaster General Burleson. The Call alleged Burleson, by cancelling the Call's second-class mailing privileges, "misused and abused" his powers, "unlawfully, wilfully, negligently and maliciously violated the rights and privileges of the publishers of the Call."

FRENCH FLEET TO SAIL ON A SECRET MISSION

PARIS, March 3.—Detachments of the French Mediterranean fleet have been ordered to prepare to sail for an "unknown destination." The entire fleet was ordered to proceed to Toulon for coaling and two cruisers and three torpedo boats will then sail on a secret mission.
