ATLANTA, March 5.—(U. P.)—A general strike was called by the Atlanta, Birmingham & Atlantic railroad as a protest of the wage reduction. Approximately 2000 workers were affected, the union officials said.

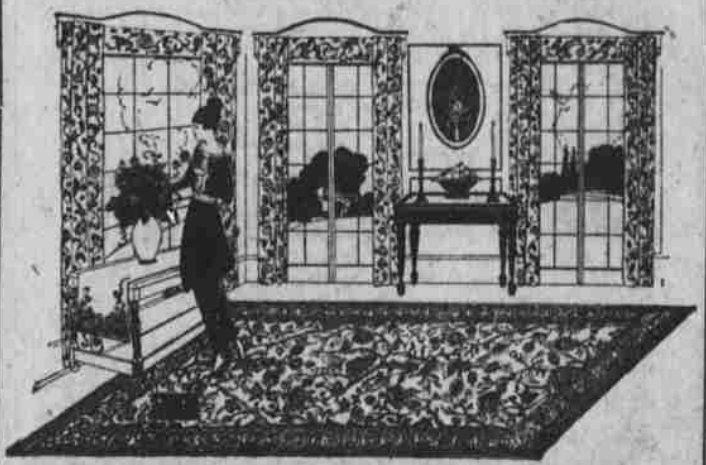
