CHICAGO MAN INVENTS ASTRONOMICAL CLOCK

CHICAGO, March 10.—(U. P.)—Michael Buika of Chicago has invented a remarkable astronomical clock which has attracted much scientific interest.

In a glass dome on top are a miniature sun, earth and moon whose movements duplicate those of these bodies in the heavens. The sun remains stationary, but the earth turns on its axis, the moon revolves around the earth and both planets circle the sun. The globes representing the sun and moon are coated with phosphorus and show the nights and days and the various phases of the earth's satellite. Eclipses of the sun and moon are clearly indicated.

The amazing thing about it is that the earth revolves every twenty-four hours and the earth and moon take twelve months to complete their circuit about the sun while the markings on the face of the clock records the changes in days, weeks, months and years.
