OREGON'S DEATH LIST IN WORLD WAR IS 934

SALEM, March 17.—(U. P.)—Oregon recorded list of dead in the world war service totals 934 men. Adjutant General George A. White has announced following the completion of a state-wide survey and compilation.

CHICAGO, March 17.—(U. P.)—The railway executives branded as "absolutely false" the charges by labor leaders that the wages of railroad employees are arbitrarily fixed by a small clique of officials. The denial is also made that the unions claim that some railroads are opposed to abrogation of national agreements, but that the influential railroads are able to force issue.
