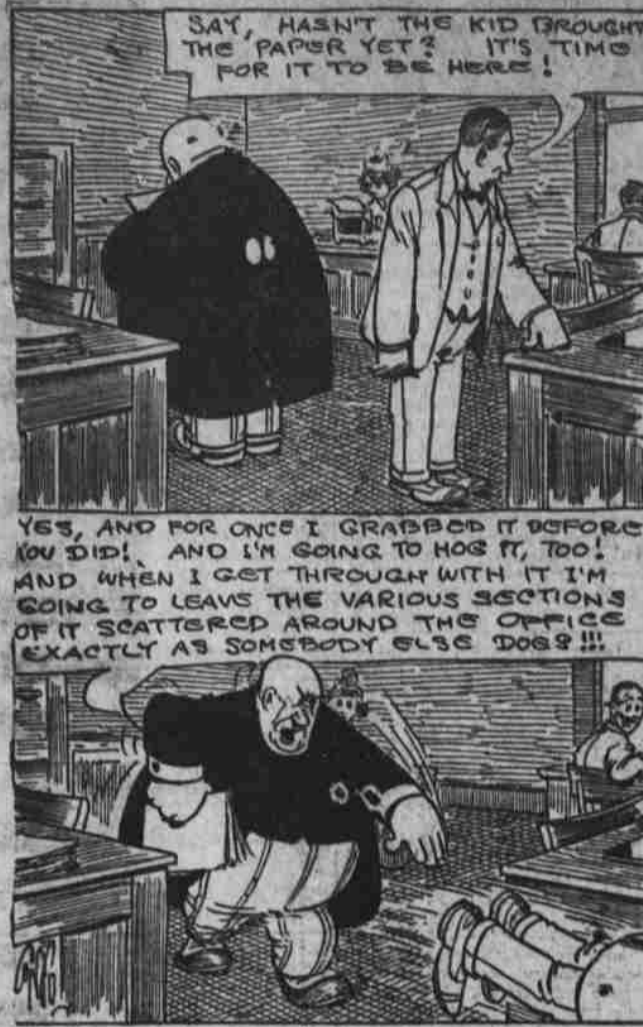
In the hog sales there were only about three loads available for the Monday morning market. It might be imagined that a showing of strength resulted from the furnished supply.

ITALY SENDS SURPLUS CITIZENS TO AMERICA

ROME, March 22.—(By Henry Wood, U. P. Staff Correspondent.)—Despite the emigration restrictions that are still in force in many countries since the war, Italy's emigration statistics for 1920, just completed, show that her ever increasing excess of population cannot be kept at home.

As in pre-war years, the United States and Argentine continue to be the two great drawing centers for Italian emigrants. Although Italy's emigration for 1920 is still a long way from equalling the figures attained before the war, yet the increase over that of 1919 is very great.

In 1912, the last year before the war broke up Italy's normal emigration currents, her emigration reached the total of 872,598. During the war all emigration ceased.

In 1919 her emigration reached only 50,598, but in 1920 it attained a total of 263,000, or nearly half of the 1912 record. Unless emigration restrictions or foreign countries limit this human current, Italian emigration authorities are confident that the present year will see the normal pre-war emigration re-established.

One of the most important benefits which Italy counts on receiving from her emigrating class is that of their contribution towards the re-establishment of Italian exchange. All Italian emigrants invariably send home a large part of their savings and these can be counted on to build up a nice little balance of foreign credits and money that will go far towards re-establishing the foreign exchange of the lira.

Italian emigration divides itself into two currents, that which goes merely to European countries and that which is trans-oceanic. The former for 1920 was 211,227, while continental emigration was only 153,717.

During the past year the emigration to the United States quadrupled that of 1919.

Export Buying Strengthened Wheat.

CHICAGO, March 22.—(A. P.)—Export buying on a liberal scale lifted wheat prices somewhat Monday but demand slackened and grains were practically wiped out. The market closed nervous.

Estimates of the amount of wheat taken for Europe varied from 1,500,000 bus. to double that total. How much of it was domestic and how much foreign could not be readily ascertained; knowledge that active measures were being taken to facilitate passage of a new emergency tariff counted likewise in favor of the bulls and so did scantiness of rural offerings.

Buying power, nevertheless, became almost exhausted after midday and this fact led to some speculative selling pressure. Favorable weather and crop conditions were additional bearish factors.

Damage resulting from the elevator explosion here gave an upward swing to corn and oats for a while but the effect failed to last. Provisions were governed chiefly by the action of hog values, which although at first higher underwent sharp breaks.

Cold Storage Meat Stock Is Low.

CHICAGO, March 22.—(A. P.)—Cold storage stocks of meat and lard in the United States on March 1, were less by approximately 125,000,000 pounds than last year, the Institute of American Meat Packers announced today. This figure included stocks both in cold storage and in the packing plants. The total supply on hand was given as 1,255,598,000 pounds, declared to be a "normal average supply."

"Since the United States consumes about 34,400,000 pounds of meat daily, the quantity in storage would have been sufficient to fill national needs for only 23 days," the institute said.

NEW YORK, March 22.—(A. P.)—The visible supply of American and landed grain shows the following changes: Wheat decreased 1,820,000 bushels. Corn decreased 2,953,000 bushels. Oats increased 561,000 bushels. Rye decreased 55,000 bushels. Barley decreased 43,900 bushels.

Bethlehem Steel Earned 36 Millions

NEW YORK, March 22.—(A. P.)—Gross sales and earnings of the Bethlehem Steel Corporation for 1920 were \$274,431,225, a decrease of \$7,210,671, according to the report issued today. Total net earnings of \$46,251,554 showed a decrease of \$1,989,665 and the net income of \$14,458,836, or 5.27 per cent, was less by \$598,925.

Electric Earnings Good in 1920

NEW YORK, March 22.—(A. P.)—Total sales of the Western Electric Co. during 1920 were \$206,112,000 as compared with \$135,722,000 for 1919. The annual report today showed net earnings amounted to \$8,277,414, while those of 1919 were \$5,652,085. The net earnings for 1920 were 7.3 per cent on the average investment.
