BILLINGS, Mont., March 22.—(A. P.)—A thrilling chase, part of the time on snowshoes, in the wilds of the Upper Gallatin river, has just been concluded by A. T. Holmes, deputy game warden here and Deputy Frank Marshall of Three Forks. They were after two elk tooth hunters, and while they did not succeed in taking the men they are believed to have driven them out of the country.

This section is almost trackless and with the snow 40 inches deep on the level, pursuit was slow. The wardens saw many herds of elk, some of them as high as 160 head.
