- Notice of Street Improvement
- Notice is hereby given that at a regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pendleton held at the Council Chambers in Pendleton Oregon on March 16th, 1921, the following Resolution was duly adopted, viz:
- WHEREAS, the City Surveyor of the City of Pendleton did on the 8th day of March, 1921, under direction and by requirement of the Common Council file in the office of the Recorder of the City of Pendleton, plans and specifications for an appropriate im-

provement of the following named street in said city:

Thompson Street from the north right of way line of the O. W. R. & N. Co. to the south line of High Street, together with the estimates of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof and a statement of the lots, parts of lots and parcels of land to be benefited by such improvement and the percentage of the total cost of improvement, which each of such lots, parts of lots and parcels of land should pay on account of the benefits to be derived from such improvement, and WHEREAS, the Council has examined such plans and specifications and estimates and found the same satisfactory and the estimates therefor to be in accordance with the probable cost of such work, and

WHEREAS, the property recommended by the City Surveyor to be included within the boundaries of the district benefited is in the judgment of the Common Council properly to be included within such improvement District and no property is excluded therefrom which should properly be included therein, and

WHEREAS, the improvement of the hereinabove described portions of Thompson Street either gravel Bithullitic pavement, concrete pavement or Warrenite Bithullitic pavement on crushed rock or crushed gravel foundation is at this time necessary, therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the Common Council of the City of Pendleton that it is expedient to improve and it is hereby proposed to improve Thompson Street from the north right of way line of the O. W. R. & N. Company to the south line of High Street, by paving the same with either gravel Bithullitic pavement or concrete pavement or Warrenite Bithullitic pavement on crushed rock or crushed gravel foundation; such pavement to be finished upon the established grade of said street and the street to have curbs and gutters and all other things in accordance with and as shown in the plans and specifications for the improvement of said portions of Thompson Street from the north right of way line of the O. W. R. & N. Company to the south line of High Street, prepared by P. B. Hayes, City Surveyor, filed with the Recorder of said City on the 9th day of March, 1921, which said plans and specifications are hereby particularly referred to, and be it further

RESOLVED that the Engineer's estimates of the probable total cost of such improvement, which said City Engineer's estimates was made and prepared by P. B. Hayes, City Surveyor, of said City, in the sum of \$13,345.56 and was filed with the Recorder of said City on the 9th day of March, 1921, is hereby included and hereby referred to particularly; and be it further

RESOLVED that the plans and specifications and estimates for such improvement as prepared by the City Surveyor and filed with the Recorder of the City of Pendleton on the 9th day of March, 1921, be and they are hereby adopted and approved, and be it further

Resolved that the cost of making such improvement shall be a charge and lien upon all lots, parts of lots and parcels of land to be benefited by such improvement, and the owners of such lots, parts of lots and parcels of land so specially benefited by such improvement shall be liable for the payment of the costs thereof, and be it further

RESOLVED that an Assessment District is hereby created to be known as "Assessment District No. 78" embracing the property benefited and to be assessed for the payment of such improvements, which Assessment District shall include all lots, parts of lots, and parcels of land lying and being within the district bounded and described as follows, to-wit:

Description of Assessment District

Number 78.

Commencing from the northeast corner of lot 12, block 112, Reservation addition to Pendleton, Oregon, thence 1305 ft. 2 3/8 in. in a southerly direction and parallel with the east line of Thompson Street, thence 260 ft. in a westerly direction and parallel with the south line of High Street, thence 1205 ft. 2 5/8 in. in a southerly direction parallel with the west line of Thompson Street, thence 269 ft. in an easterly direction and along the south line of the O. W. R. & N. Co. right of way line to the point of beginning. And be it further

RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution together with a notice that the surveyor's estimate of the proportion of the cost of said work to be charged against each lot, part of lot and parcel of land is on file in the office of the City Recorder, be published for a period of ten days in the East Oregonian, which newspaper is hereby designated by the Common Council for the publication thereof.
