provided by the committee of seven. The system has three fundamental elements: the grain grower, the local cooperative elevator company or grain growers' association, and the central sales association.

The plan would, in the opinion of the committee, eliminate waste in distribution, excess freight charges, provide for orderly marketing and more stable prices, and add materially to the net returns to the grower without increasing the price to the consumer.

Grain selling would be concentrated in the hands of a national sales association with membership and voting control limited to actual grain growers. This sales association would establish branch offices at all principal grain markets, including seats on boards of trade should they be found desirable.

Complete Plans Made

The plan would establish a complete system of gathering and interpreting statistics of world conditions affecting supply and demand and would establish means for financing orderly grain marketing through a subsidiary warehouse corporation will provide terminal and district warehouses with cleaning and conditions in machinery. An export corporation also a subsidiary, would find outlets

for surplus grain. All money received for grain less operating and handling costs, would be returned to the growers. The national sales agency, in brief, is governed by farmer elected directors and controlled by finance, terminal warehouse, export, service and other corporations.
