## U. OF O. CHOOSES 16 REPRESENTATIVES FOR TRACK MEET APRIL 9

California-Michigan Meet Will be on Berkeley Oval; Muller Entered for Discus Throw.

BERKELEY, Calif., April 1.—(A. P.)—Sixteen men have been chosen to represent the University of California in the California-Michigan track meet on the Berkeley oval April 9. Of the number Hendrixen who is to run the 440-yard dash for California, holds the present inter-collegiate A. A. A. record for that distance, 48 2-5 seconds. Hutchinson, one of those to compete in the sprints, finished but two fifths of a second behind Padlock in the 220 yard dash. Padlock made the distance in 29 4-5 seconds, Hutchinson, tying the old world's record of 21 1-5 seconds. Muller, entered for the discus throw, high jump, broad jump and pavilion throw in the coming meet, took part in the Olympic games last year, taking second in the high jump.
