## FRISCO WINS TENTH CONSECUTIVE VICTORY BY BEATING OAKLAND

**Seals Maintain Winning Streak by Consistent Playing; Free Hitting Marks Loose Game.**

OAKLAND, Cal., April 15.—(A. P.)—San Francisco defeated Oakland again yesterday, 12 to 5, registering the 10th consecutive victory for the Seals. Major Davis of Oakland, pitched the first ball, the game marking the formal opening of the season in Oakland. The Seals started the fireworks without delay, securing three runs in the first inning. In the third inning they filled the bags, and Couch's single brought two men home. Wrammer was replaced in the sixth by Kersten, who was in turn replaced by Schullis. Brubaker got a home run in the second hit bounding into the bleachers. Oakland played a loose game throughout.

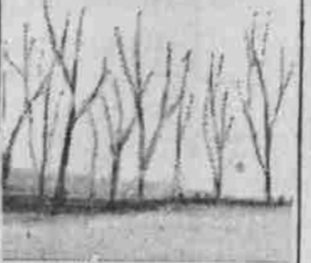
## WASHINGTON STUDENTS TOUT UNIVERSITY AS CONFERENCE WINNERS

**Baseball Team Not Hit Hard by Graduation Last Year; Team Will Tour Orient Soon.**

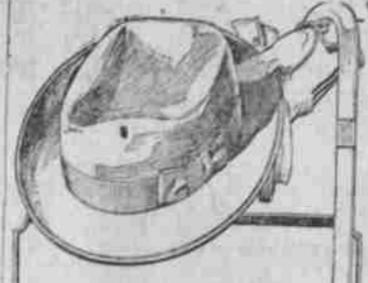
SEATTLE, Wash., April 15.—(A. P.)—University of Washington students already are claiming the baseball championship of the Northwest Conference for their varsity nine this year. The Washington nine of 1920 was not hit hard by graduation and it readily gained more material from the freshman team of last year than it lost by the four-year route.

According to reports from other conference schools, the Oregon Agricultural College team will be strong this year but the Washington State College and the University of Oregon nines may not loom up strong in the present race. No Pacific Coast Conference baseball championship will be fought for this year as Stanford University and the University of California, the two southern members of the coast organization, have not scheduled games with the northern members. Washington's nine, according to present plans, will leave in July to tour Japan, Stanford and California. It is said, are also planning to send their teams to the Far East this year.

The Newport Harbor Yacht Club has chosen this date and other clubs are expected to open near that time. Ideas weather is forecast. Canvas propelled craft will hold chief interest, according to Dr. Albert Solland, admiral of the newly organized southern California Yacht Club, but motorboat and speedboat enthusiasts predict a good year. Plans are in the making for several yacht races during the summer.

## BABE RUTH STILL HAS HIS OLD COMBINATION

NEW YORK, April 15.—(A. P.)—The New York Americans opened the season yesterday with an 11 to 1 victory over Philadelphia. "Babe" Ruth, New York batting star, started with two doubles and three singles in five times at bat. He cleared the bases with a triple in the eighth. Only four Philadelphia players reached first.

## COLLEGE WONDER WILL TRY OUT WITH DETROIT

ANN ARBOR, Mich., April 15.—(A. P.)—Eighteen games won out of 19 pitched is the two year record at University of Michigan by Vernon L. Parks, who resigned recently as captain of the Wolverine nine following discovery that he had pitched for the Portland club of the Pacific Coast League last year. In both 1919 and 1920 Parks pitched the Michigan team to "Big Ten" championships. During the first season he won every game in which he played. In 1920 he lost the final game with Illinois, played after Michigan had clinched the title. Parks pitched seven games during the 1919 season, six of them conference engagements. His batting average for that year was .249. In 1920 he hurled 12 games, striking out 90 batters during the season. His batting average last year was .214. In a single game last year he struck out 17 men and in another 16. Parks plans to join the Detroit Americans for a tryout as soon as he is graduated in June.

## MEXICAN LABORERS ARE FOUND BOUND IN CHAINS

DALLAS, April 15.—(U. P.)—Charges that Mexican laborers were found in chains in west Texas ranch houses, are among the allegations of the Mexican penance under investigation by the department of Justice. Forest M. Spencer, chief of the federal investigation, said, Spencer said more than 20 Mexicans, being held for involuntary labor purposes near the border, will be taken before the grand jury at Abilene, next week. To supply the demand for "matadors" in Spanish bullfights, a school has been opened in Madrid by an expert. The pupils fight a dummy bull on wheels and operated by the instructor, and they must learn to avoid being "gored" by the rubber horns. But graduates must take real live animals before receiving their diplomas.
