#### NEWS OF FARM AND RANGE

Instructions Given. — Potato seed treatment for 1 1/4 to 2 hours with corrosive sublimate 4 ounces to 20 gallons of water is recommended as a profitable practice by the O. A. C. extension station. It will control both root and rhizoctonia to a large extent. Metal vessel should not be used. The "30 day" codling moth spray is timed by the following conditional rule: When the evening temperature reaches 60 or above in late May—about 5 p. m.—the first generation of codling

moths may be expected to deposit eggs. The spray applied then will be ready for the worms which hatch in 8 to 16 days.

Plowing Is Finished.—Plowing on the Elmer Moore ranch and on the Collins & Moore ranches is finished, says Elmer Moore, who was in Pendleton Saturday. Mr. Moore says that compared with other years, plowing was completed early in the season.

Snow in Mountains.—The higher altitudes of the Umatilla national forest were visited by light snowfall during the past few days, says J. C. Kuhns, forest supervisor. With the abundance of moisture, range prospects are exceedingly bright.

County Has Most Bees.—Umatilla county has more bees than any other

county in the state of Oregon, according to statistics issued by the United States census bureau. On nearly every farm in the Milton-Freewater region and in the west end of the county, near Hermiston, Stanfield and Echo, farmers keep bee hives. Honey from this county is famous and besides its consumption here, much is shipped to other regions.

Potatoes Inspected.—J. B. Wiley, general agricultural supervisor for the Washington counties; J. M. Lewis, county agent for Columbia county, Wash., and Fred Bennion the Umatilla county agent, were in Weston recently making an examination of its mountain potato product. The value of the local potatoes for seed purposes is said to have been the subject of these

three agricultural experts. They are also said to have found it free from "wilt."

Wheat Prospects Good.—Never has the wheat crop looked so promising at this time of year than now, says E. P. White, prominent farmer of this county. Mr. Marshall says that the wheat is growing in fine shape and is all that could be desired.

Have Home at Umatilla.—One year ago, Mr. and Mrs. Marvin Turner of Pendleton left for Umatilla to make their home. Today they have a comfortable home and have cleared a portion of land and put in alfalfa. They are raising chickens and have planted a garden also.
