ATTEMPT TO REACH SETTLEMENT.

LONDON, April 28. (A. P.)—The conference attempting to reach a settlement of the coal strike was resumed today. Sir Robert Horne, chancellor of the exchequer, is understood to have told the miners' delegates the government had made a further offer to meet their position to the extent of contributing 500,000 pounds sterling or more monthly during the transitional period, so that the reduction in wages would not exceed three shillings.
