BOSTON, May 14.—(A. P.)—The Commercial Bulletin says: The demand for wool has improved somewhat in the past week, although trade has been by no means brisk and prices are still more or less erratic.

Some buying of fine and fine medium wool is reported in the far west at prices varying generally from 14 to 17 cents, depending upon the wool.

Farm Bureau Gets

CHICAGO, May 14.—(A. P.)—The general officers of the American Farm Bureau federation, under whose leadership the national cooperative grain marketing plan incorporated as the United States Grain Growers, was inaugurated, announced yesterday that organized agriculture was practically a unit in favor of the plan.

Reports of favorable action, it was said to have been received from farmers' organizations in Kansas, Iowa, Nebraska, Washington and Idaho. The wheat growers' association of Washington and Idaho, it was said, has voted to join the United States Grain Growers, Inc., en masse on the basis of pooling 100 per cent of a crop.

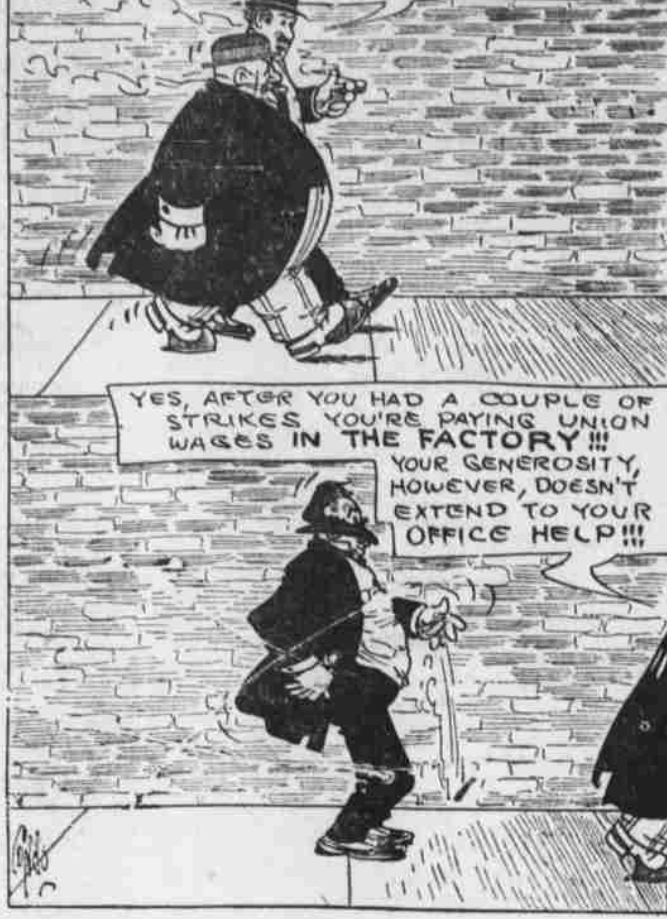

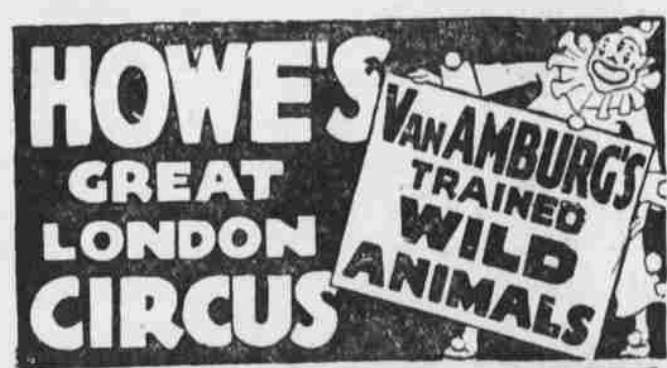
