RAYBORN MINE REOPENED

BAKER, Ore., May 19.—(U. P.)—Repeatedly turned down by mining experts, yet today a consistent producer of rich silver ore—such is the "come-back" record of the Bay Horse Mine at Huntington.

The Bay Horse was only recently reopened, and this in the face of advice by some of the most competent engineers in the business. Today it is shipping ore at the rate of two carloads a week to Salt Lake smelters, and because of heavy production now in sight negotiations are under way for the reopening of another smelter at Sumpter, Oregon.

J. L. Magna, mining engineer of Spokane, is the man given credit for the "come-back" of the Bay Horse. In spite of consistent unfavorable reports, Magna advised that a final trial be made by cross-cutting from the six-foot wall of the mine.

This was done.

The crosscut progressed but a few feet when a six-foot vein of rich silver ore was tapped. The vein is said to be yielding consistently, and the Bay Horse property, once condemned as worthless again, brims with activity.

BERLIN, May 19.—(U. P.)—This is a little story concerning the Kaiser, tapestry, court architects and blades of grass.
