

P.) -Bank deposits here have remained virtually stationary for three months, thus forcing the banks to resort to emer-gency measures to meet demands of arge depositors for payrolls and simflar purposes. They are depositing se curities with the government and having money printed to order,

The curious situation is ascribed principally to the law governing depositors, which requires a complete identification of the individual. Many persons object to this, not wishing to isclose their assets for taxation and preferring to have many small bank counts under different names. The bankers have asked for the repeal of
