NEGOTIATIONS FAIL AND WARFARE IS EXPECTED

LONDON, May 22.—(A. P.)—Diplomatic negotiations have been broken off between Zehntou Saad Pasha, head of the Egyptian Nationalists, and Adly Yeghen Pasha, the Premier, who has been trying to effect a compromise with the extreme elements of nationalism and actual warfare between the supporters of the two leaders is feared, says the Cairo correspondent of the Morning Post.

The Yeghen party is supported by a small body of the intelligent elements and by prominent local Jewish families who have large material interests at stake.

Zehntou's followers are students, tradesmen and laborers chiefly.

A third party, known as the Dissidents, comprises the influential pashas, lawyers and a large section of the educated people.

Adly Yeghen stands for ministerial negotiation with England for a settlement of the Egyptian problem; Zehntou is striving for direct nationalist negotiations with England disregarding the ministry; and the Dissidents desire ministerial negotiations with England, but wish the result of the negotiations to be submitted to the nationalists for approval prior to the signature of an agreement.
