U. S. ACCEPTS SITE FOR NEWEST NAVAL BASE AT ASTORIA

Ceremonies Today Mark First Step in Construction of Station at Oregon Seaport.

ASTORIA, May 26.—The United States government today accepted as a gift from the people of Clatsop county the location at Tongue Point for the next great naval base on the Pacific coast. W. B. Allison, commanding the man-of-war here for the occasion, took formal possession of the site, in behalf of the navy department, while civil officials of Oregon, Astoria and neighboring cities were in attendance at the ceremonies arranged by H. C. Keauhi, commandant of the 13th naval district, and the Astoria naval base commandant.
 Construction work on the station is expected to begin immediately after the formal transfer, as the initial appropriation has already been made by congress and a naval officer detailed by the bureau of docks and yards to draw up the plans and details.
 The position of the base, guarding as it does the great valley of the Columbia, is considered one of the most strategic in the country. It is located on the great fresh water bay just east of the city boundary of Astoria, is protected by Tongue Point and is reached by a wide, deep channel from the Pacific ocean, only 15 miles away. The Astoria harbor, with its entrance depth of 42 feet at low water is the largest fresh water harbor in the world.
 Present plans call for the construction on this great body of water of a submarine and airplane station, which will be increased to a naval base of the first caliber when further appropriations are available.

UNIQUE TREE PLANTING.
 FARMINGDALE, N. Y., May 26.—(A. P.)—Planting of a white oak tree in soil collected from every country associated with the United States in the war and from every state in the union marked the commencement exercises today of the New York state institute of applied agriculture.
 More than a year was taken to collect the soil from the various countries, and as it arrived it was baked, in order to insure productivity.
 The members of the Worcester, Massachusetts, Interdenominational Ministers' Association have agreed to refuse to solemnize the marriage of any couple whom they deem unfit for its sacred responsibilities, and to refuse remarriage to the guilty party in divorce proceedings.

JAPANESE IS ARRESTED.
 NAGOYA, Japan, May 26.—(A. P.)—Harry F. Hawley, American consul here, said today that his seven-year-old son, recently injured by a Japanese while playing at the consulate, was not cut in the right arm as reported, but was beaten. The Japanese, who was arrested, confessed. The Japanese entered the garden of the consulate and poked ridicule at children playing there, among them several Japanese. Mr. Hawley's son ordered the invader out but the Japanese pulled him into the street, kicked him and knocked him on the head. The boy who fell into the gutter, meanwhile had defended himself with a stick. The lad was bruised but not seriously injured.
