REOPEN LIME PLANT
GOLD HILL, Ore., May 27.—(A. P.)—Plans for the reopening of the state lime plant at Gold Hill are being prepared by C. W. Courtney, of Grants Pass, former superintendent of the plant, whose recommendation in that capacity has been made by the state board having charge of the plant. The board proposes to lease the Gold Hill quarry and adjacent lands to the local cement plant and open a shellmound deposit here in the valley, and supply the material in conjunction with ground limestone for fertilizers.
