COLUMBIA CITIZENS ARE IMPROVING CITY PARK

 COLUMBIA, May 29.—The warm days of the past week, with the thermometer about the 90 mark, has helped the alfalfa to some extent. If the weather continues as it has been, there will be a good cutting of alfalfa for the first crop. The work will be in progress in a week or two.

Members of the county court have left for Portland where a meeting will be held and the contract for the Cold Springs road will be let.

The road to be improved consists of a stretch of 13 miles from Holdman to Cold Springs, through Columbia, and will be graded and graveled. There is hope in the near future of seeing the diagonal road from Hermiston connect with the Cold Springs road making it a highway as any in the state. The diagonal road is just about finished and sightseers not satisfied to wait for its completion have been motoring out taking in the sights in these parts. On Sunday many new people inquired for friends and well-known places on the project and many visited the government reservoirs.

Columbia Park has recently had some additional improvements. The fence has been completely built, gates painted and some new seedling done. Much credit must be given the park board as well as other past boards for their work in accomplishing so much toward beautifying the five acres of the park as has been done at the great expense of time invested, under the jurisdiction of the Neighborhood Club, who has it under their care.

The old fashioned ball given by the community ladies was a great success, and the old fashioned costumes as well as the old style dances were very enjoyable and furnished amusement galore. About a hundred dollars was realized which will go toward 1 Park fund.
