300 HAYING HANDS ARE NEEDED IN WEST END OF UMATILLA COUNTY

Three hundred haying hands are needed in the west end of the county for three weeks of haying and growers will pay \$2 a day and board and \$2 to stackers, according to Don Campbell, Lee Savelly, Otis McCarty, Sloan Thompson, Allen Thompson and O. W. Falstaff, who are in Pendleton today from the west end of the county in search of men.
It is estimated that 200 of the men will be used between Echo and Stanfield and 100 at Hermiston. Farmers have listed their wants at Henry Hitt's cigar store in Hermiston, Jones & Gilbert's at Echo, and at the Stanfield Hotel, Stanfield.
Fred Hennion, county agent, has already sent a number of men to meet the demand. He states that the unemployed men in this region are eager to respond to the call for laborers. The work will continue practically up to the time of wheat haying.
The Oregon Hay Growers Association, formed recently in the west end, now has 4,000 acres contracted for, which makes the incorporation effective. The association is planning to meet soon, to elect permanent officers and a manager and to pass on a tentative agreement with the Washington haygrowers, utilizing a mutual sales agency.
