MANY VISIT SHOW.

OREGON AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE, June 4—More than 500 persons visited the flower show given by the botany department. The display tables were covered with roses and the flowers attractively shown with a background of green. All the plants were identified with both the common and botanical name. Visitors were especially interested in the smallest flower known which must be seen with the aid of a microscope. Dr. Helen M. Kilkey, assistant professor of botany in charge of the show, plans to make the display an annual affair and on a more extensive scale.
