DENVER, Colo., June 6.—(A. P.)—The following message from President Harding was received yesterday afternoon by Governor Oliver H. Shoup:

"I am deeply distressed to read of the great misfortune which has come with its toll of death and destruction to the citizenship of Pueblo and the valley of the Arkansas river. It is most reassuring to know how nobly your state has met the great emergency.

"If the federal government can be of aid to you, pray, please do not hesitate to advise, because all the people of the United States are touched by the sorrow and distress which has come to the people of Colorado."
