PRESIDENT OF TACOMA BASEBALL CLUB RESIGNS

TACOMA, Wash., June 8.—(U. P.) Dr. J. W. Van Valkenburgh has resigned as president of the Tacoma club of the Pacific international league, giving his reason as "too much grief in the minor league baseball." His resignation followed the refusal of the Yakima club to play a series here, protesting the action of President Burnett of the league in exonerating Manager Blankenship of the Victoria club for his part in the recent fight on the playing field at Yakima. Van Valkenburgh maintains that Yakima officials broke faith by refusing to make the switch.

NINE YEAR OLD BOY INJURED IN ACCIDENT PROVES VERY BRAVE

SALEM, Ore., June 8.—(A. P.)—"Don't take me home, it will scare my grandma."
This was the plea yesterday of 9-year-old Ralph Delaney after he had been run over by a motor truck loaded with cement and fearfully injured. Three ribs were broken and physicians could not say whether he would recover. The boy attempted to catch onto the truck as it passed a schoolhouse. Witnesses say the driver was not to blame. Though in distressing pain the boy kept back the tears and manifested rare nerve for one of his years, the doctors said.

PRIESTS RECEIVE SENTENCE

DUBLIN, June 8.—(A. P.)—A court martial has sentenced Rev. P. Gaynor and Rev. M. McKenna, Roman Catholic priests of Mullagh, County Clare, to six months' imprisonment without hard labor. Testimony was given that in the house occupied by the priests were found two documents. One denounced the protection of the British government and pledged "our house and ourselves under the protection of the Irish republican movement." The second document purported to relate to the Dal Eireann.
