'NEVER AGAIN' IS DECLARATION MADE AFTER JAIL FINE

Babe Ruth Serves Six-Hour Sentence and Then Breaks Law Getting to Ball Game.

NEW YORK, June 9.—(A. P.)—It takes more than a jail sentence to keep Babe Ruth from playing ball. "Babe served six hours—a technical day—in the traffic court 'pen' yesterday, made a wild trip to the polo grounds and played three innings of a winning game against Cleveland. After paying his \$100 for speeding about a week ago, he began serving one day "in confinement" because this was his second offense. If the meter of a newspaperman's taxi, which followed him to the park could be depended on Babe again violated the speed law before he had been out 10 minutes. He covered the nine miles to the field in about 15 minutes. As four o'clock, the time for his release approached, the same torpederoader that twice led to his arrest, awaited him. He sped away from a cheering crowd with a policeman on the running board to clear the way and Magistrate McGeehan seated beside him to see that he would not be "pinched" again. He arrived in time to swing a bat in the sixth inning. The crowds in the stands did not recognize him at first. There was a pause, then the crowds rose to their feet and cheered. Chester Williams is the proudest colored boy in the city, for he has the distinction of being the only man who served a sentence in the same pen with the home run champion. Chester said Ruth kept to himself, had a gloomy face "a mile long" and refused even to join in a dice game. "I'll never get caught speeding again in this town," Chester said. Babe remarked sadly, but when I get out I'm sure going to hustle out to that game. Keeping a man here this way all day just makes a speeder of him."

TOTAL OF COUNTRY'S WHEAT CROP FORECAST. WASHINGTON, June 9.—(U. P.)—The department of agriculture forecasts the country's total wheat crop for 1921 at 2,200,000 bushels. This compares to 1,787,000,000 in 1920. Included in the 1921 total is over 500,000,000 bushels of winter wheat compared with the same for last year, a quarter of a billion bushels of spring wheat, against 209,000,000 bushels last year. The acreage in winter wheat is 2 and 5-10 percent greater than last year. The condition of winter wheat on June first is estimated at 27.3-10 percent, compared with 78.2-10 percent the same time last year. Other crops, except oats and rye are in excellent condition.

AIRPLANES REACH EUGENE. EUGENE, Ore., June 9.—(A. P.)—Twelve United States army airplanes on June 15 will begin their summer task of patrolling the forests of western Oregon to detect and report forest fires. The planes will be stationed at Eugene and will be commanded by Captain Lowell H. Smith. Cooperation between the army air service and the forest service has been assumed.
