Irrigation League Champions

Hermiston won the championship of the Irrigation League, the Bucks picked the banner from the Wheat Belt League, so it will be a case of victor meeting victor tomorrow. How will Pendleton behave with a rival of little pitted against her?

To determine this question a number of local fans will make the trip to Hermiston to watch the favorites while they measure prowess with the Irrigationists. The game will be called at 3 o'clock, and that will leave plenty of time to get down to see the game start.

BALL BAT ARGUMENT.

SACRAMENTO, Cal., June 11.—(A. P.)—Sacramento came from behind a three run lead and defeated Salt Lake, 5 to 3. Reiser, Salt Lake pitcher, was put out of the game by Empire Croter in the second inning for disputing a decision at first base. After the game, Joe Wilhoit, who had also been involved in the argument, rushed at the umpire with a bat. Croter prepared to meet the player with his fists and only the interference of several players and a policeman averted a fight.

Crankcase Lubrication Demonstrated
A recent test showed that to prevent excessive engine wear, crank case oil should be changed at least every 1500 miles, preferably every 1000 miles. A new engine that was run 1000 miles with oil changed at proper intervals, upon being disassembled showed no signs of wear. The same engine reassembled and run 4000 miles with oil plus new oil as needed, upon inspection showed a wear of 0.015 inches. Motor truck and passenger car manufacturers recommend that crankcase be drained every thousand miles, the engine flushed with kerosene and new oil added.

Radiator Within Flywheel.

An automobile radiator has been placed within a flywheel by a Roumanian inventor, the water being cooled as it is whirled around.

Electric Windshield Cleaner.

A new windshield cleaner for automobiles can be heated electrically to melt snow and ice.

Capt. Tails Make Overalls.

The tails of a duster coat designed for automobiles can be wrapped around a wearer's legs and buttoned to form loose trousers.

GEN. GRANT'S FLAG IS PROPERTY OF GRANT MEMORIAL ASSOCIATION

NEW YORK, June 11.—(A. P.)—The American flag used at Gen. Grant's field headquarters during the civil war and now in his tomb on Riverside drive has become the permanent property of the Grant Memorial Association by the will of the late Gen. Horace Porter. A fund of \$10,000 is left for the care and maintenance of Grant's tomb. General Porter's servants were among the beneficiaries, each receiving a year's salary. The will also cancelled a mortgage for \$7,100 on the home of Gen. F. Holt, the general's chauffeur. Most of the estate went to relatives.

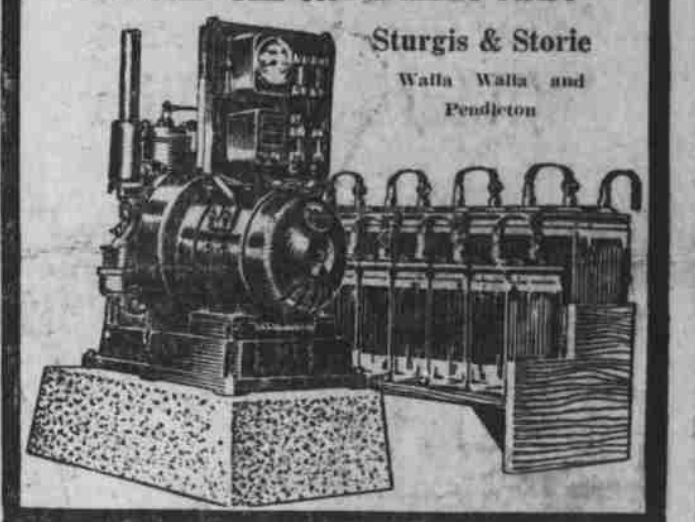
