ROADS' CONDITION GOOD AUTO CLUB REPORTS

Following is the weekly report of road conditions of Umatilla county and Eastern Oregon issued by the Eastern Oregon Auto Club:

Columbia River Highway—Pendleton to Portland. Pendleton to Deschutes river good gravel road exception of small stretch under construction near Blalock. Deschutes river to The Dalles take detour over hill owing to construction, rough hill but fair road. The Dalles to Mosier, new gravel road. Mosier to Hood River closed for paving. Passage through highway before 8 a. m. of noon and after 5:30 p. m. as well as Sundays and holidays. Hood River to Portland paved. Oregon Tourist and Information Bureau and Oregon State Motor Association in Portland.

Old Oregon Trail—Pendleton to Salt Lake. Pendleton to La Grande over Blue Mountains. Good gravel highway exception 20 miles dirt and rock road five miles at crest rough. La Grande to Baker excellent. Baker to State Line good with two detours owing to construction. State line to Boise fair and good. Boise Auto Club for Salt Lake route.

Oregon Washington Highway—Willows to Walla Walla via Pendleton. Willows to Heppner through lone good dirt road. Heppner to Pilot Rock fair to good. Pilot Rock to Pendleton part under construction, most good road. Pendleton to Walla Walla paved except four miles, detour. Complete in 10 days. Tri State Auto Club, Walla Walla.

La Grande-Enterprise Highway—La Grande to Enterprise open, detours, not good but passable.

Enterprise-Flora Highway—In fair condition, traffic steady.

Baker-Cornucopia Highway—Good road, some hard surface.

Baker Unity Highway—Fair to good with some rough stretches.

Pendleton Cold Springs Highway—Good by way of Holdman or South Cold Springs to Landing.

Other Routes

Pendleton to Spokane good to excellent by Central Ferry and Colfax except eight miles near ferry very rough. Inland Automobile Association at Spokane for roads east and north.

Pendleton to Seattle via Walla Walla, Pasco and Yakima, generally good. Pendleton to Lehman Springs, open and fair.

Pendleton to Bingham Springs, fair and good.

Pendleton to Helix, hard surface all the way. Leave Oregon Washington Highway at Havana.

Pendleton to Heppner via Echo, Columbia river highway to Echo. Echo over Butter Creek hill, dirt road, very good.

Road conditions generally in Eastern Oregon are at their best. Recent rains have settled any dust and mountain roads are now dry. Many detours make driving slightly slower for much is under construction. Detours are generally good and well marked. Tourist traffic is greatly increased, 356 tourist cars registering in Pendleton last month.
