RECORD NUMBER OF BOYS AND GIRLS OF COUNTY PASS TESTS

Total is 347 From Eighth Grade With 186 Girls, 161 Boys; Teachers Better Trained.

A total of 347 pupils of the eighth grade in Umatilla county have won the right to diplomas for graduation from the common schools of the county, a study of the figures that have been made by the superintendent of schools shows. Of this number 186 are girls and 161 are boys, a difference of 25 in the girls' favor.

The examinations were held in May and June, and the percentage of applicants passing the test has been higher this year than ever before. The good showing made by the students is attributed to the better preparation of the teachers for their work, and to the fact that the school sessions in many cases have been 10 months long this year.
