WASHINGTON, June 29.—(U. P.)—New vice presidents and three new members of the board of directors of the American Forestry Association announced today by Charles Lathrop Paek, president, including the name of Mrs. Warren G. Harding as a vice-president.
 Dr. Henry S. Drinker, former president of Lehigh; Charles F. Quincy of New York city, and Dr. Hugh P. Eaker of New York city, all directors of the American forestry association, have been made members of the forestry committee of the U. S. chamber of commerce which committee is in session in Chicago this week. From there the committee goes to the Pacific coast to gather data as to the requirements for a national forest policy.

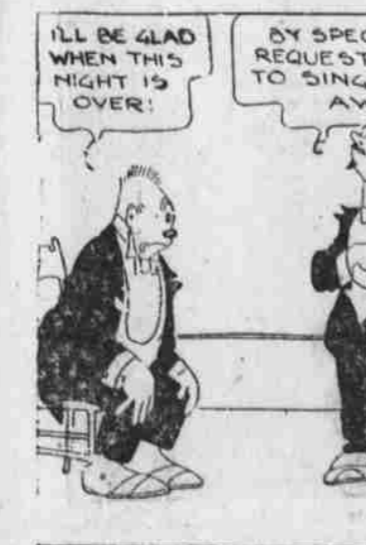
