"THE FAITH HEALER" BASED ON THEORY OF DIVINE POWER IN AFFAIRS OF MEN

Healing by faith, or a demonstration of the presence of divine power in human affairs is the basic theme in George Melford's latest Paramount picture, "The Faith Healer," which will be shown at the Arcade Theatre today.

The play upon which the picture is founded, was written by William Vaughn Moody, whose play "The Great Divide" scored success some years ago. The stage production of "The Faith Healer" also proved highly successful.

The story concerns a young shepherd who sees the divine light and suffers. OWEN MOORE COMING IN "A DIVORCE OF CONVENIENCE"

It takes a bit of hilarious fun to extricate all parties from their predicament.

Owen Moore's success in similar roles in "The Poor Sinner" and "The Chicken in the Case" guarantees that his performance will be one of the "laughter sensations" of the season. He has surpassed all other comedians in his impersonation of young men gone temporarily "crazy" on account of heart troubles. The story of "The Divorce of Convenience" is by Victor Heerman, who directed Mr. Moore's previous successes, and was directed by Robert Ellis, one of the cleverest directors on the screen staff.

PORTLAND, June 24—(U. P., N.S.)—Charges that the anti-race at Linn-ton docks Monday night in which one striking seaman met death in a gun fight with the police, was the result of an official plot by the seamen's union, will be made by the government appointing U.
