CHINESE OFFICIAL SAYS JAPAN WILL GO TO WAR WITH U. S. IN 1924

Japanese Work in Ten Year Cycles; Had War in 1904, 1914 and Expect 1924 Scrap

SEATTLE, June 27.—(U. P.)—W. E. Priestley, a Seattle fireworks manufacturer, told the United Press that Dr. Sun Yat Sen, president of the Chinese republic, called him into his office and warned him that Japan was preparing for war against the United States. "Doctor Sun," said Priestley, "declared that the Japanese are preparing to declare war on the United States in 1924. The Japanese work in ten year cycles, Sun declared. They launched a war with Russia in 1904, and are preparing the biggest scrap of all for 1924."

BANDIT IS KILLED AS HE ATTEMPTS ROBBERY

ALBANY, June 27.—(A. P.)—An attempt to break into the Halberstam bank at Halsey was frustrated early today. One of the gang was killed in a running battle with the posse. P.)—In an addendum to the recent sweeping reduction of 12 per cent in wages to the American railways the United States Railway Labor Board today slashed the pay of 27 classes of employees from five to 15 cents an hour effective on July 1 when the new cuts go into effect, saving many millions of dollars to the railways of the country annually.
