PENDLETON RANKS FIRST IN TOWNS OF STATE

OREGON AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE, Corvallis, July 4.—The principal cities in Oregon have been compared for the purpose of determining their relative advantages regarding education and living conditions. College students in city government courses, under the direction of Dr. F. A. Marquardt of the department of political science, collected the data. Increase during the last few years in property values, average per capita bank deposits, educational advantages, street improvements and death rates were among the points of comparison.

That no section of the state has any particular advantage over another in regard to desirable cities was shown by the fact that the six leaders on the graph worked out by the class—Pendleton, Klamath Falls, McMinnville, Portland, Marshfield and Albany, in order—are in widely divergent geographical sections. The 23 cities were divided in four divisions, a comparison in regard to place being the determining factor in classifying them. Minor differences were not taken into account within the classes.

Salem has the lowest death rate among the cities compared, it was found, from 1916 to 1920, and Bend has a greater increase in population, on a percentage basis, than all the other cities combined.

Property valuation, per capita, was highest in Portland in 1920, and Portland also led in per cent fire protection efficiency and average salary of its school teachers. Portland had the next lowest death rate.
