FEDERAL LAW IS ASKED TO PROTECT ELK HERDS

(By International News Service)
 WASHINGTON, July 5.—As a result of the mid winter experienced in many parts of the country, Uncle Sam's famous elk herd, which was reduced from about 20,000 to 9000 during the winter before, probably will stage a strong rally, the field workers of the biological survey have reported to the department of agriculture.

During the previous winter the food shortage was such that the herd in the district around Jackson Hole, Gros Ventre and Buffalo Fork valleys was simply starved and frozen out. The contrary prevailed last winter. With plenty of forage and easily accessible because of lack of heavy snow, the herd pulled through and has a most favorable outlook.

The agents point to the need of suitable government-owned winter ranges, stating that those set aside experimentally have not proved desirable. State and federal legislation to protect the herd is needed, it is said, if these valuable animals are to be preserved.
