MRS. KABER SENTENCED TO LIFE IMPRISONMENT

CLEVELAND, July 16.—(A. P.)—Mrs. Eva Catherine Kaber today was found guilty of murder in the first degree but with the recommendation of mercy by the jury which tried her on charges of plotting to kill her husband, Daniel P. Kaber. She was sentenced to life imprisonment in the Ohio reformatory for women at Mansfield. Under the Ohio law there is no hope of pardon under the verdict.
 Mrs. Kaber was in a stupor all night, after having been carried from the court room. The jury began balloting just two years after the time Kaber was stabbed to death by assassins alleged to have been hired by his wife. For two years Moses Kaber, the aged father of the murdered man, doggedly kept working on the mystery with the aid of private detectives. Finally a brother of Mrs. Kaber was brought in as a ruse and her mother, Mrs. Mary Brickell, who was suspected of knowing much about the murder, was led to believe her son was to be charged with the crime. The ruse worked. Mrs. Brickell, to save her son, is alleged to have confessed, implicating her daughter, Mrs. Kaber, Miss Marian McArdle, Mrs. Kaber's daughter, herself, and others.
