SCIENTISTS TO TEST ARCTIC AIR WAVES

EDMONTON, Alberta, July 21.—(I. N. S.)—Harold Bibby is about to set out for the Mackenzie river, where he will set free little balloons and watch them sail into the sky. Crazy? No, he is attached to the meteorological service and will take this way of studying air and weather conditions.

He will settle down for a year's stay almost directly on the Arctic Circle at Fort Good Hope, an old fur post of the Hudson's Bay Company. He is taking along 400 rubber balloons. They are two feet in diameter and will be filled with hydrogen gas. He will release these little balloons at the rate of one a day until the close of the summer of 1932.

As each balloon rises ten miles or more its course will be followed with delicate recording instruments. Some of the tiny flying ships will carry instruments which automatically will record air density and wind movements in the higher atmospheric levels. Three out of five will be lost, but the information obtained from the other two, it is expected, will justify the effort and expense.

Mr. Bibby will also carry out a program of magnetic observations. He will build a magnetic hut at Fort Good Hope, in which he will set up an elaborate outfit of modern weather and time recording instruments. A careful check will be kept on wind and weather every day.

This will be the first work of the kind ever done in the Far North. It has been planned by Sir Frederick Stuart, meteorologist of Toronto, and the observations taken by Mr. Bibby will fit into a general scheme, of which similar expeditions to Spitzbergen and the North Pole, planned by the International Meteorological Committee will form part.

The time to use lime depends primarily upon convenience, although the fall or spring is usually considered a better time to apply lime as it can be spaded and harrowed in after the seed bed has been prepared. Lime should never be plowed in because it works downward and naturally leaches into the lower layers of the soil.
