Profit Taking Results In Wheat Depression

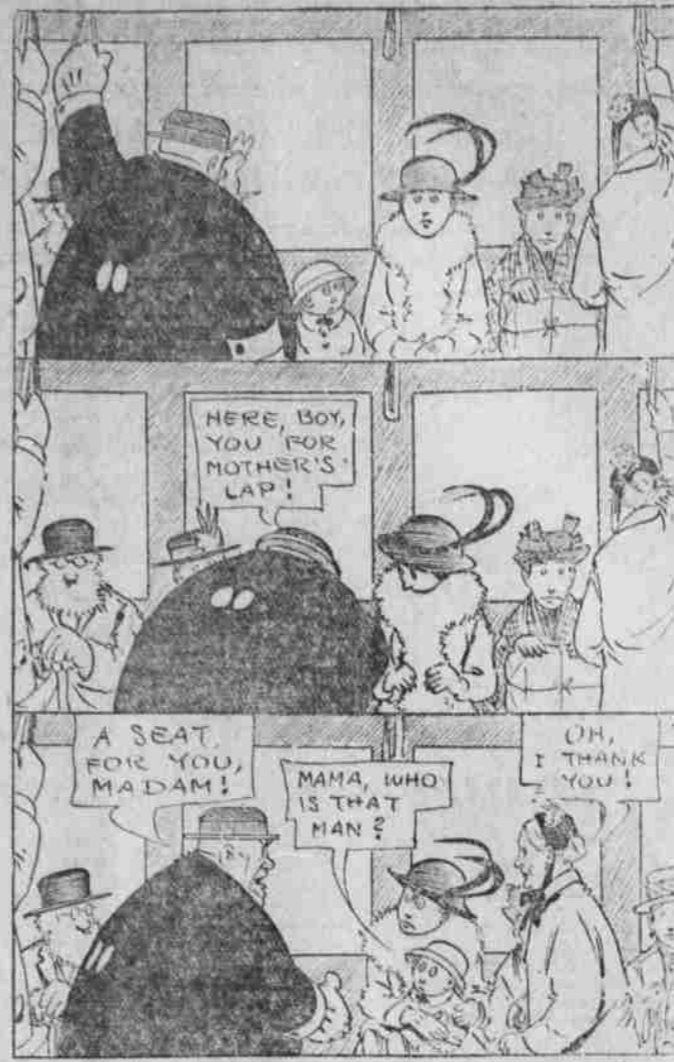

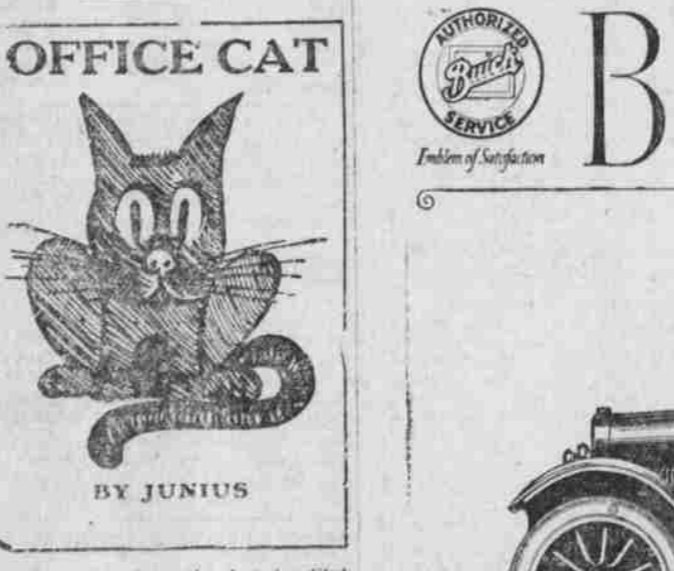

Trade and Industry Quiet, Broadstreet Reports

NEW YORK, July 23.—(A. P.)—Broadstreet's today says: Trade and industry as a whole seem quieter than any time since early in the current year. The most activity was shown in light wearing apparel, evoked by reductions in price. Cotton goods for next spring, notably gingham, opened at about the present season's prices, have sold well; cotton goods as a whole are fairly firm; stockings for next spring are to be opened next week by the leading interests, shoes, and to lesser extent leather and hides have sold better, with some shoe factories reported well employed, the matter of finding the railway debts to the government for capital outlays is making headway; railways are speeding up shop repair work and plans for financing cotton and wheat shipments needed by Europe are under active consideration. CURIOUS PLANT PROVES NUISANCE TO MOTORIST

The motorist and cyclist accustomed to contending with all the difficulties of the road is now faced with another problem, according to the United States Department of Agriculture, which has recently undertaken a nation-wide survey concerning the rapid spread of the tribulus terrestris or Devil's Hair, as it is called in Arizona.

This troublesome weed is said to have its origin in southern Europe, and was probably introduced into this country by means of hays adhering to the fleeces of sheep. It has now made its appearance in California, Arizona, Texas, Iowa, Illinois, Arkansas, Kansas, Indiana and Nebraska. The vines lie on the ground in such a manner that one of the sharp long spines always points upward ready for the first tire that comes along. In one Californian county it is estimated that at least a half of all bicycle tire punctures and a good part of tire troubles experienced by the motorist are caused by the weed, which by reason of its color, and because it lies so close to the road, is almost indistinguishable even in broad daylight. Besides the sharp spine, this weed produces spiny seeds which attach themselves to the tire, being carried long distances, every revolution of the wheel makes tending to press the sharp points further into the tire.
