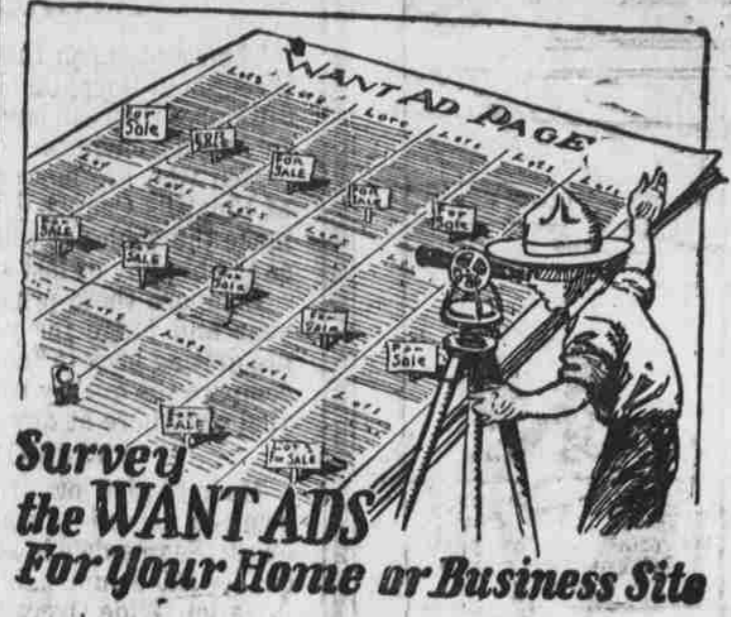

### TEACHERS ARE ELECTED FOR HERMISTON SCHOOL

HERMISTON, Ore., Aug. 3.—Hermiston schools will open September 5 with a corps of 13 teachers, eight in the grades and five in the high school. A. C. Voelker, who has been principal here for a number of years will again be in charge.

The teachers are as follows: Miss Edith Graves, first grade; Miss Hazel Rogard, second grade; Mrs. Ruth Wiley Lewellen, third grade; Mrs. M. S. Miller, fourth grade; Miss Bernice McCoy, fifth grade; Miss Margaret O'Leary, sixth grade; Mrs. L. C. Morris, seventh grade; Mr. A. C. Bensen, eighth grade.

In the high school there will be one more teacher than last year. A. C. Voelker will handle some of the mathematics in addition to his work as principal. Arnold L. Gralapp who comes here from Adams will teach science and coach athletics. Mr. Gralapp is a graduate of the University of Washington.

Mrs. Roberta M. Gunn will have charge of the English department this year. Miss Jessie Brierley will again handle Latin. Miss Florence Long, a graduate of Whitman college will teach history and handle girls' athletics.

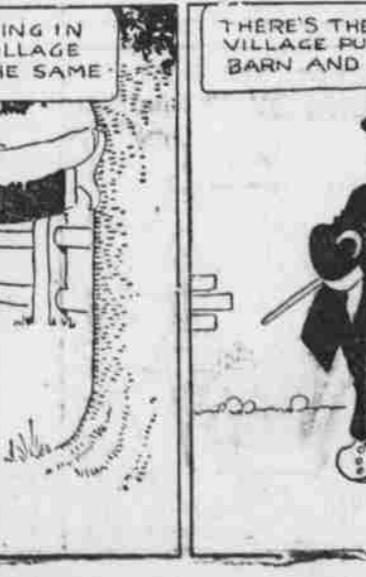
