BRINGING UP FATHER

As a result of the manufacture of ordnance material for the fleet in the early fifties under the direction of Admiral Dahlgren, the Washington Navy Yard gained a reputation as the most important land branch of the nation's naval system.

In 1849 Admiral Dahlgren superintended the firing test of an elongated shot and shell invented by John Prentiss, which could take the rifle motion from the smooth-bore cannon and keep its front end in the proper position. This was a considerable advance in the manufacture of big shells and naval cannon, and in a short time the admiral had gained such extensive knowledge of all branches of ordnance that he became a noted authority on these subjects. He later invented the famous Dahlgren gun.

A ship's soldier was carried by air ambulance from Forts. of the Olympic peninsula of Washington, to Camp Lewis for treatment in one day. The aviator traveled above a cloud blanket on a course of 150 miles, on a day too cloudy for flying over the forests with safety.
