## SERVICES FOR AMERICAN AND BRITISH DEAD FROM ZR-2 DISASTER HELD

Cruiser Will Arrive With Bodies Shortly and Services Will be Held in America.

LONDON, Sept. 8.—(U. P.)—Impressive simplicity marked the memorial services for the American and British dead from the ZR-2 disaster in Westminster Abbey, King George and Queen Mary attended the services. Chaplain Wiener, of the Royal Air Force referred to the dead as "martyrs to science." The Cruiser Dauntless is expected to arrive in the United States with the American bodies shortly, when memorial services will be held on Brooklyn piers September 17. High naval officers will participate in the services.

## BOXER DIES FOLLOWING INJURIES RECEIVED IN SIX-ROUND FIGHT MATCH

KANSAS CITY, Mo., Sept. 8.—(A. P.)—Harold (Tiger) Gaubling, 21 years old, died yesterday from injuries supposed to have been received Monday night in a six-round boxing bout.

E. A. Enright, county attorney, announced a warrant charging in voluntary manslaughter would be issued today for "Battling Joe" Woolf, Gaubling's opponent. A brother of the fighter said he would not press prosecution of Woolf because he did not feel the fighter was to blame.

SHEDS COAT AND ESCAPES. CINCINNATI, Ohio, Sept. 8.—(I. N. S.)—Slipping out of his coat when seized by federal prohibition officers, a man eluded the officials by running. The attempted arrest occurred during a raid on an auto loaded with whiskey.

RATTLESNAKES ANNOY PICKERS. HORNELL, N. Y., Sept. 8.—(I. N. S.)—Berry picking has been greatly interfered with and made dangerous this season by numerous rattlesnakes. While Stephen King, of Hornell was picking berries he was bitten by a rattler, which clung so tenaciously to his thumb that it had to be pulled away. Black snakes, which fight off rattlers, are to be brought into the berry section.

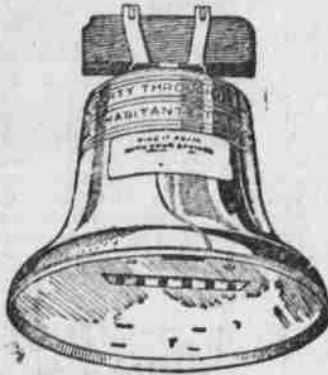
