colors are as beautiful as those seen in the Colorado.

Hawaii wants Chinese labor more than any other one thing, the publisher declares.

"We have too many japs now," Mr. Hooper said. "During the era of high prices they made with their bonuses as much as \$100 to \$300 a month on a labor scale of \$15 a month. So you can see what the bonus amounted to. Many of these foreigners either sent their money home or they used it to start in business for themselves. In either case, we derived no more benefit from their presence because we couldn't use their labor. The money they earn is turned back to Japan, either directly or indirectly. If we can't get Chinese labor to work on the big sugar plantations, it means that many of the small operators will have to close down and that the acreages on the big places will be materially cut. We don't want the Chinese permanently but on a basis of contracts to last either three or five years."

Good roads is one of several matters to which Mr. Hooper is giving special study during his tour of the United States. He is also studying the workings of commercial organizations, and this morning he met Claude Barr, secretary of Pendleton's Commercial Association and had a long talk with him.

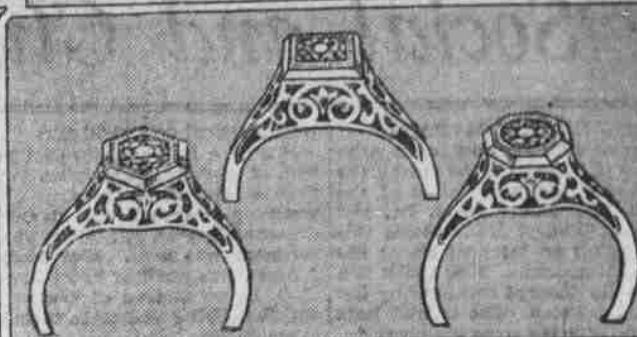
