ANTI-RACE WAR IS ONLY MATTER OF SHORT TIME

GREELEY, Colo., Sept. 27.—"Creation of a national will," which will overcome the obstacles of race antagonism, will be the salvation of America, Dr. Edward A. Steiner, professor of sociology at Grinnell College, Iowa, told a class at the Colorado Teachers' College here.

"When the decay of the American race comes it will be through lack of spiritual life rather than through lack of certain pure blood strains, Dr. Steiner declared.

"Our salvation lies in the creation of a nation which can overcome even the handicaps of race," he asserted. "Nations become what they will be, and the maintenance of that will lies very much in the hands of the school teachers of our land. Our salvation depends upon a determination to live like the sons of God. This will save us more than the de-

termination to keep our blood strains pure, a task that is impossible.

"We are Americans, and we have shown the world the miracle of the Stars and Stripes; now we must show the world the miracle of the Cross—the great spiritual atonement through which the world can be saved."

Dr. Steiner delivered a series of lectures here on the "Problems of Race." Speaking on the World War, he said:

"The idealistic war aims were not realized because it is not the nature of war to realize them. The world is not safe for democracy; neither has the earth been made a better place for men and women. Internationalism is consumed by a fierce nationalism, and the instinct for separation has all but crushed the desire for unity.

"The advance of the means of communication as a help toward cultural and spiritual unity has been checked by great chasms which opened suddenly between nations; also between neighbors and fellow citizens. An earthquake at the face of the earth so the war has created its own political, mental and spiritual geography."

Rising barrier between races are results of the World War, according to Dr. Steiner, who declared:

"In the United States the relation between blacks and whites is growing more tense, and a general race war seems only a matter of time.

"Our anti-Japanese and anti-Mexican attitude is more bitter because of the race factor.

"And an anti-Jewish campaign is on and may become a factor in national politics and business."
