WINTER HOLDS DRAB PROMISE FOR PETROGRAD

 PETROGRAD, October 29.—There is another Petrograd not suggested by talks with the Soviet leaders at Smolni or meals in the restaurants and cafes opened in the Nevskii Prospect by aristocratic ladies now turned profiteers—the Petrograd of the common people—and I was at pains to discover it.
 The plight of the average citizen both as regards fuel and food is a very terrible one, and as the winter approaches it is likely to become almost unbearable. The fuel shortage is more acute than during the past three winters for the very reason that the expedients that were adopted were such as cannot often be repeated.
 Hardly a ton of coal can be bought in Petrograd, and the price of wood has risen to a level which places it out of the reach of everyone except the very rich.
 "Necessity the Mother."
 Public and private ingenuity to provide fuel for the Winter months has not yet happily been exhausted. The director of the Classical Theatres, for instance, has used the knowledge acquired when he was a practicing architect to strip the roof of all unnecessary wood, which he proposes to use for heating the theatres during rehearsals and public performances.
 Wooden houses, pianos, superfluous doors, tables, chairs and other pieces of furniture have been chopped up to be used later as fuel. The canal barges are also being sent to Petrograd, not carrying wood, unfortunately, but to be broken up themselves for household heating and cooking purposes.
 One barge is allotted to each block of flats for fuel, provided the residents of the favored block—naturally there are not enough barges to supply the needs of the entire population—will break it up and carry the wood from the canal to their homes.
Food Shortage Acute
 The food shortage is very acute, although large classes of official workers—Government clerks, dockers, school teachers, soldiers and secret police—get fairly substantial rations. The recently opened shops gave a few people, moreover, the opportunity to supplement official rations, but that the prices charged for them are too high for the purses of the overwhelming majority is shown by the following list:

 Even at the present exchange such foodstuffs in terms of English money are very expensive, cocoa thus costing five shillings a pound, butter and sugar four shillings, and condensed milk two shillings a tin.
Ill-Nourished Children
 Doctors here estimate that 30 per cent of the population is undernourished.
 The plight of the 150 British residents in Petrograd—to mention another item in the general misery—is particularly pathetic, as their nationality excludes them from a share in Government rations.
 British governesses, clerks and one-time prosperous business men whom I have met expressed surprise that neither the Government nor any private relief organization had so far come to their help.
