HENSHAW PREACHES ON NEW TESTAMENT CHURCH

At the First Christian church last night, Evangelist J. E. Henshaw preached a clear and thorough-going sermon on "The New Testament Church." He spoke in part as follows: "The only foundation on which to stand when we talk about the New Testament church is the Bible. The only authority upon which men can agree is that of the word of God. Divisions come from things taught by men, not from what the Bible teaches. Nothing is more clearly indicated in the Bible, nor becoming more clearly realized by leaders in all churches than the fact that denominationalism is a sin."
"The New Testament church was founded by Christ at the first Pentecost after His resurrection, in Jerusalem, by means of the Holy Spirit's guidance of men who were followers of Christ."
"How may we identify the New Testament church? By its authority which is vested in Jesus Christ (Matt.
