TOPEKA, Kan., Dec. 5.—(A. N. S.)—Topeka has the honor of having had formed in her midst the first American Legion Father's organization. One hundred and forty-seven fathers of World War veterans are charter members.  
 The official name of the order will be the American Legion Father's Association. The purpose of the fathers as announced in the preamble of the constitution is to give assistance in every way possible to the American Legion in its activities toward the development of real Americanism.

ENGRAVED CARDS ARE FAD-COBBLENZ, Dec. 5.—(A. P.)—Engraving calling cards are a time and money saving device for the American force in Germany. Nearly every soldier has engraved cards with his name and address on them. Some have other cards with their home address in the United States particularly those who are planning to return to America within the next few months.
