Rails Strong In Market of Weakness.

NEW YORK, Dec. 20.—(A. P.)—Although week end developments were mainly favorable, yesterday's stock market moved irregularly in almost all branches. A few affiliated issues were the only prominent exceptions.

Winnipeg Price Boosts Wheat Price.

CHICAGO, Dec. 20.—(A. P.)—Wheat took an upward swing yesterday largely as a result of indications of export business at Winnipeg.

At first wheat showed a lack of support, with many traders correctly anticipating an increase of the United States visible supply.

The increasing importance of the United States as a center of world finance was further illustrated by the sale in this market of \$25,000,000 Canadian Pacific railway debenture stocks.

Bonds followed the uneven course of stocks, liberty 3 1/2s showing marked depression while victory 4 3/4s duplicated their recent maximum.

CHICAGO, Dec. 20.—(United States Bureau of Markets.)—Cattle—Receipts, 23,000; few sales beef steers, she stock and bulls 25c higher; quality plain; bidding lower on veal calves, stockers and feeders steady.

Hogs—Receipts, 48,000; opened like Saturday's best time; later steady with Saturday's average; bulk 190 to 240-pound average.

Sheep—Receipts 21,000. All classes opened about steady. Fat lambs to packers, early, 49.75@50.25; good fed shorn lambs, 49.25; light fat ewes, 45; good comeback feeder lambs, early, 49.75.
