## PREDICTS THAT BRITISH EMPIRE WILL TUMBLE

LONDON, Dec. 20.—(U. S. S.)—"I hope and believe that one hundred years hence there will be no British Empire. Either it will have played its part in the development of civilization and have changed into and given place to a much larger union of free states, or it will have become a danger and a nuisance to mankind, and have followed German Imperialism and Roman Imperialism to the dust heap."

This is H. G. Wells' opinion of the British Empire a hundred years hence. It was read as a message from him at a dinner given by the Delphian Coterie, when the subject for consideration was "The Empire a Hundred Years Hence."

## KAUAI IS NOT OLDEST VOLCANO IN HAWAII

HONOLULU, T. H., Dec. 20.—(U. S. S.)—Prof. Harold H. Palmer, geologist at the University of Hawaii, in a recent statement discredits the time-honored theory that Kauai, most northerly of the inhabited islands of the Hawaiian group, is geologically the oldest, saying that evidences have been found of volcanic activity both on Kauai and Oahu, near Honolulu, dating back only about two hundred years.

Volcanic activity on the islands north of Hawaii, where the active volcano of Kilauea is located, has not been recorded in historic times. Geologists have estimated the most recent activity on the northern islands at about 500 years ago. No intimation is had as to how Professor Palmer's theory will be received by the scientific world.

A process has been developed for the manufacture of a palatable sirup from the sweet potato, which, it is believed, will provide an outlet for the cull and surplus crop.
