PORTLAND, Ore., Feb. 27.—A new post of the American Legion has been admitted to the ranks in the approval of a charter for Echo, making the 110th in the state. The post was named after Don Hoffnagle, an Echo veteran who lost his life in France. Maurice Coe was elected commander; John I. Howard, vice commander; Ira M. Peterson, a lieutenant; C. H. Rhee, finance officer; and Ray T. Johnson, chaplain. Eighteen veterans signed the application for charter.

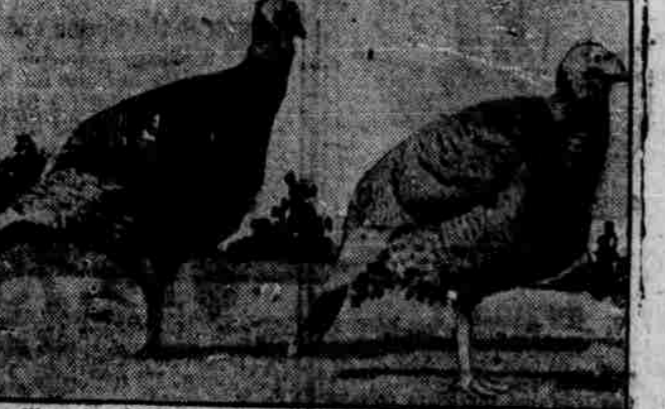


Before His Majesty, the Prince
