## CHINA HOPES FOR PLACE, SAYS HUNG

SAN FRANCISCO, March 16.—(U. P.)—China is now entering her third historical epoch since she opened her gates to western civilization, according to a statement made by William Hung, professor of history at the University of Peking, during a visit here. This epoch promises to bring about the real awakening of China, and above all, to bring closer relationship with the United States, Hung believes. "Three policies have held China's destinies," stated Hung. "First, the policy of 'all hands on'—every European nation seeking territory to maintain the so-called balance of power. "Next came the policy of 'one hand on'—that of Japan. And now, following the great conference at Washington, comes the policy that spells an equally bright future for China, and all nations of the world that deal with her—a policy of all hands off."  
 "With the nations believing in peace and progress as against war and retrogression, perhaps China will be allowed to take her lawful place in the family of nations, and contribute her best to civilization.  
 "All intelligent men and women know that the drama of future civilization will be staged in the blue waters of the Pacific. It should be a drama of peace.  
 "We believe in peace because minds are stronger than muscles, and ideals are more powerful than physical force.  
 "It is time for the world to realize that China's gate is open to all who come in a spirit of helpfulness and sympathy. It is time for all nations

**FEWER ARRESTS MADE.**  
 VANCOUVER, B. C., March 16.—(A. P.)—The annual report of the chief of police, just issued, contains figures which are very satisfactory to the Moderationists of this city. The Moderation act, which involves government control of the trade in stimulating beverages, became operative May 1 of last year. The number of arrests for drunkenness for the entire year was 662, while in 1920, when the prohibition act was in force, there were 2231 arrests on that charge. In 1916, the last year under license, the arrests numbered 1610. Figures as issued also indicate that bootlegging has almost entirely disappeared.
