seeking peoples of this and other countries by developing the recreational facilities to the highest point of perfection.

And whereas, it appears to us that the economic side of the matter has been completely lost sight of by the National Park adherents and likewise the interests of the taxpaying citizens of this state.

And whereas, we desire to call to the attention of the citizens of Portland, and the various clubs of that city, and any others who have not informed themselves of the facts, that it would be a great injustice to the economical interests of the state, and especially the welfare of the livestock and other large industries of Oregon and the Northwest, to permit the transfer of large areas of our national forests to national parks, and thereby exclude important industries from utilizing this vast area.

We desire to call attention to the fact that the wool growing industry in the State of Oregon, which represents over eighty million (\$80,000,000.00) dollars of taxable property, and that the cattle and horse industry which

represents an almost equal amount, and these combined livestock industries furnishing a livelihood for thousands of citizens, and business for many communities, towns and cities, not omitting the city and Port of Portland, vitally dependent on the use of the high, summer range in the mountains in the successful conduct of the business of producing livestock products; and we further call their attention to the fact that these ranges were used for the most part long before any national forests or national parks were established, and that such use has not impaired these areas for recreational purposes, but have been vastly beneficial in the prevention of forest fires, preserving the big timber and heavy forests from fire destruction, which timber is both a big industrial and scenic asset to the people of Oregon and the whole United States. We fail to see wherein such reasonable grazing use, is injurious to the scenic resources of the United States, but a recognized practice in the European mountains, and the herds of livestock are pictured far and wide because of their added charm to the scenic effect.

And whereas, we view with alarm this lack of sympathy of a portion of the state.

Therefore, be it resolved, that we are opposed to the addition of the sixty-eight thousand (68,000) acres of national forest area, including Diamond Lake, under the McNary bill; which, we believe, is only an opening wedge to place the whole summit of the Cascade range, parts of Wallowa and the Blue mountains, within the national park system.

Be it further resolved, we are unalterably opposed to any further additions of national forest area in the state of Oregon to the national park system.

Be it further resolved, that we call upon the various communities, towns and cities of the state, who are mindful of its best interests, to work with us to defeat the efforts being made to forever tie up large areas of the state


