John Armstrong was brought before a New York commission and adjudged insane, and placed in confinement. John Armstrong escaped and went to Cobham, Virginia, where he established a residence, and where another commission declared him to be sane. The governor of Virginia refused to issue extradition papers, sending him back to confinement in New York. John Armstrong is now interested in keeping the country boys on the farm, and is touring every state in the union, about New York—trying to interest educational authorities in his idea.
 "Visual education for rural communities is my plan in a nutshell," declared Chaloner. "There is too great a drift to the cities. America will soon become a country importing foodstuffs instead of exporting them if the disproportionate growth of the cities compared with the farm communities continues."
 "Briefly, my plan is this: A portable projecting moving picture machine which can be attached to an automobile. One such machine should be allotted to each county. The county is divided into ten districts and each district is given motion picture entertainment once every two weeks.
 "Educational films of high quality would be shown in the afternoons, and good clean comedies at night.
 "This plan will keep the boys at the cross-roads instead of in the big cities. Wherever it has been tried it has been a success, and soon becomes very nearly self-supporting. I plan to visit nearly every state in the union, and confer with all state educational authorities. My trip will take two years. I will have visited 24 states before I return to my home in Virginia next winter.
 Chaloner conferred with state officials of California, and from San Francisco will work his way north into Oregon and Washington.
